Monitoring of the Execution of the Consolidated, State and Local Budgets in Ukraine

- The actual intake of revenues of the consolidated budget of Ukraine totaled UAH 497.0bn in January-June 2017, which is UAH 157.5bn or 46.4% more year-on-year.
- The state budget received UAH 391.7bn in the same period, which is UAH 128.0bn or 48.5% more year-on-year. This amount equals 53.8% of the annual plan. This is significantly more than the share of revenues for the first six months in the total annual revenues in the last ten years. As the six-month amount was on average 45.4% of the annual intake, there is a high likelihood of exceeding the plan in annual terms.

Compared to last year, growth is noted for all key items of both tax and non-tax revenues, both by month and over the period of January through June in general. The following intake rose in particular: personal income tax revenue by UAH 7.5bn (or by 27.9%), corporate profit tax by UAH 7.2bn (or 29.5%), VAT on goods made in Ukraine by UAH 19.5bn (or 28.9%), VAT on imports by UAH 34.1bn (or 42.3%), excise tax on goods made in Ukraine by UAH 5.4bn (or 21.4%), rent and fees for use of other natural resources by UAH 6.2bn (or 31.6%), and import duty by UAH 1.9bn (or 21.2%).

Non-tax revenues also increased (by UAH 38.6bn or more than double). This occurred primarily thanks to the remittance by the National Bank of Ukraine of UAH 20.0bn according to the Law of Ukraine "On the National Bank of Ukraine".

• Expenditures of the consolidated budget totaled UAH 443.8bn in January-June 2017, which is 26.7% or UAH 93.4bn more year-on-year. In June 2017, expenditures amounted to UAH 84.8bn, which is 27.2% or UAH 18.2bn more than in June 2016.

The amounts of consolidated budget expenditures increased for nearly all items of the functional classification of expenditures compared to June 2016.

The highest growth (2.2 times against June 2016) is noted in the expenditures for economic activity, which reached UAH 8.3bn. Significant growth occurred in the expenditures for environmental protection (69.9%), housing and communal services (62.0%), spiritual and physical development (60.7%), education (46.3%), healthcare (40.8%), general government functions (39.7%), public order, security, and the judiciary (22.5%), and defense (16.1%).

Expenditures for social protection and social security decreased by 3.4%.

• The actual expenditures of the state budget of Ukraine totaled UAH 366.0bn, which is 21.8% or UAH 65.6bn more year-on-year. In June 2017, the expenditures amounted to nearly UAH 66.0bn or 20.4% more than in June 2016.

In terms of expenditure items by **functional classification**, the following changes were observed compared to June 2016:

- expenditures for general government functions (without expenditures for state debt servicing) increased by 21.4% to UAH 2.3bn. The expenditures for state debt servicing totaled UAH 6.4bn, down 2.6% year-on-year;
- expenditures for defense increased by 16.2% to UAH 5.6bn;
- expenditures for public order, security, and the judiciary increased by 22.1% to UAH 7.5bn;
- expenditures for economic activity increased 2.6 times to UAH 4.3bn;
- expenditures for environmental protection increased by 87.2% to UAH 378.4mn;
- expenditures for housing and communal services increased 2.0 times to UAH 1.0mn;
- expenditures for healthcare decreased by 0.4% to UAH 778.5mn;

- expenditures for spiritual and physical development increased by 80.6% to UAH 645.9mn;
- expenditures for education increased by 29.4% to UAH 4.9bn;
- expenditures for social protection and social security decreased by 19.4% to UAH 9.9bn.

The expenditures for financing pensions, bonuses, and extras to the pensions awarded under pension programs and the deficit of the Pension Fund were incurred at the amount of UAH 9.1bn, which is 22.2% less year-on-year.

The state budget receipts from repaid loans totaled UAH 42.0mn in June of this year, including receipts of the General Fund of the state budget of UAH 24.8mn;

In June 2017, the state budget **provided loans** for a total of UAH 618.8mn.

The state budget surplus totaled UAH 2.6bn this month.

Repayment of the state debt principal totaled UAH 10.14bn in June 2017, including internal debt repayment of UAH 10.1bn and external debt repayment of UAH 41.3mn.

The state borrowing totaled UAH 2.8bn, with UAH 2.4bn mobilized on the internal market. External sources **provided loans** totaling UAH 481.4mn, which were credited to a special fund for financing joint development projects with international financial institutions.

Privatization of state property generated UAH 38.0mn for the state budget in June 2017.

• The total local budget revenues (without inter-budget transfers) amounted to UAH 104.2bn in January-June 2017, which is 37.5% more year-on-year.

These revenues totaled UAH 18.4bn in June 2017, which is 38.7% more year-on-year. As usual, the personal income tax was the single largest source of revenues for local budgets. It generated nearly UAH 10.0b in June. Local taxes and fees provided UAH 2.9bn.

The highest growth of revenues was in Odesa Oblast, where it grew by 80.9%. Revenue fell slightly in Luhansk Oblast (-0.7%).

• The local budget expenditures (without inter-budget transfers) totaled over UAH 214.6bn in January-June 2017, which is 49.5% more year-on-year.

In June 2017, expenditures grew by 49.4% against June of last year to nearly UAH 42.2bn. The largest amounts of local budget expenditures were allocated for education, social protection and social security, and healthcare. They amounted to UAH 17.4bn (or 41.3% of all local budget expenditures), UAH 7.9bn (or 18.8%), and UAH 7.4bn (17.5%), respectively.

The highest growth rate by region was in Lviv Oblast, where expenditures grew by 61.6%. The lowest growth of expenditures (32.6%) was in Dnipropetrovsk Oblast.

in 2012–2017 (Less Intergovernmental Transfers)





Dynamics of the Share of Ukraine's State Budget Revenue in

Annual Amounts in 2012–2017





in June 2012–2017





in January-June 2012–2017






State Budget Value Added Tax Monthly Trends


Dynamics of Monthly State Budget Revenues from Excise Tax on

Local Budget Revenue Monthly Trends (Less Intergovernmental Transfers) in 2012–2017




Dynamics of the Share of Local Budget Revenue in Annual Amounts in 2012–2017



Growth Rates of Local Budget Revenue in January-June 2012–2017



Local Budget Revenue in June 2017





Structure of Local Budget Revenues in June y 2017




Regional Distribution of Local Budget Revenue in June 2016–2017

Diagram 6 **Budget Deficit/Surplus, Monthly Trends in 2012**




Diagram 7 **Budget Deficit/Surplus, Monthly Trends in 2013**




Diagram 8 **Budget Deficit/Surplus, Monthly Trends in 2014**




Diagram 9 **Budget Deficit/Surplus, Monthly Trends in 2015**




Diagram 10 **Budget Deficit/Surplus, Monthly Trends in 2016**






Diagram 11 **Budget Deficit/Surplus, Monthly Trends in 2017**



in 2012–2017





in 2012–2017



Structure of Actual Expenditures of Ukraine's State Budget by Functional Classification in 2012



by Functional Classification in 2013



by Functional Classification in 2014



by Functional Classification in 2015



by Functional Classification in 2016




Monthly Trends of State Budget Expenditures in 2012–2017




Dynamics of the Share of Ukraine's State Budget Total


Expenditures in Annual Amounts in 2012–2017




Growth Rates of Ukraine's State Budget Expenditures

State Budget Expenditures for General Government Functions,


Monthly Trends in 2012–2017


State Budget Expenditures for Public Debt Servicing


State Budget Expenditures for Defense, Monthly Trends in 2012–2017

State Budget Expenditures for Public Order, Security, and the


Judiciary, Monthly Trends in 2012–2017

State Budget Expenditures for Economic Activities,



State Budget Expenditures for Environmental Protection,



State Budget Expenditures for the Housing and Communal Sector,



State Budget Expenditures for Healthcare,



State Budget Expenditures for Spiritual and Physical Development,





Total Local Budget Expenditures (Less Intergovernmental Transfers), Monthly Trends in 2012–2017




Dynamics of the Share of Local Budget Expenditures

in January-June 2012–2017



Local Budget Expenditures by Functional Classification





Structure of Local Budget Expenditures by Functional Classification
