Monitoring of the Execution of the Consolidated, State and Local Budgets in Ukraine

- The actual intake of revenues of the consolidated budget of Ukraine totaled UAH 567.0bn in January-July 2017, which is UAH 178.0bn or 45.7% more year-on-year.
- The state budget received UAH 444.1bn in the same period, which is UAH 145.1bn or 48.5% more year-on-year. This amount equals 61.0% of the annual plan. This is significantly more than the share of revenues for the first six months of the year in the total annual revenues over the last ten years, which amounted to 53.0% on average. This signifies a high likelihood of plan overachievement in annual terms.

Compared to last year, growth is noted for all the key tax and non-tax revenue items, both by month and for the whole period of January through June. In particular, personal income tax grew by UAH 8.9bn (or by 27.4%); corporate profit tax by UAH 7.6bn (or 29.5%); VAT on domestically produced goods by UAH 23.4bn (or 30.1%); VAT on imported goods by UAH 39.2bn (or 41.1%); excise tax on domestically produced goods by UAH 6.4bn (or 21.2%); rent and fees for use of other natural resources by UAH 4.8bn (or 21.4%), and import duty by UAH 2.2bn (or 21.1%).

Non-tax revenues increased by UAH 44.9bn or nearly 2.5 times. This was mainly due to the transfer by the National Bank of Ukraine of UAH 25.0bn according to the Law of Ukraine "On the National Bank of Ukraine," as well as revenue from dividends accrued on shares (interest, stocks) of economic entities in which the state holds interest, which increased by UAH 9.1bn or 10 times.

• Expenditures of the consolidated budget totaled UAH 513.8bn in January-July 2017, which is 25.1% or UAH 103.2bn more year-on-year. The expenditures amounted to UAH 70.0bn in July 2017, which is 16.3% or UAH 9.8bn more year-on-year.

Compared to 2016, the amounts of consolidated budget expenditures increased for nearly all items under the functional classification of expenditures.

The highest growth (by 65.9% compared to July 2016) is in the expenditures for economic activity, which reached UAH 8.3bn. Significant growth occurred in the expenditures for general government functions (56.3%), spiritual and physical development (49.8%), housing and communal services (41.9%), public order, security, and the judiciary (38.3%), defense (35.0%), healthcare (27.3%), education (16.5%), and environmental protection (2.3%).

Expenditures for social protection and social security decreased by 16.5%.

• The actual expenditures of the state budget of Ukraine totaled UAH 420.5bn in January-July 2017, which is 20.1% or UAH 70.5bn more year-on-year. Expenditures amounted to UAH 54.5bn in July 2017, which is 9.8% more than in July 2016.

In terms of expenditures by **functional classification**, the following changes occurred compared to July 2016:

- expenditures for general government functions, without expenditures for state debt servicing, increased by 60.0% to UAH 2.7bn. Expenditures for state debt servicing amounted to UAH 5.7bn, up 6.2% year-on-year;
- expenditures for defense increased by 35.1% to UAH 5.6bn;
- expenditures for public order, security, and the judiciary increased by 37.9% to UAH 7.1bn;
- expenditures for economic activity increased by 70.8% to UAH 3.9bn;
- expenditures for environmental protection decreased by 13.3% to UAH 233.0mn;

- expenditures for housing and communal services increased 2.5 times to UAH 1.3mn;
- expenditures for healthcare increased by 26.3% to UAH 725.6mn;
- expenditures for spiritual and physical development increased by 75.6% to UAH 667.7mn;
- expenditures for education increased by 11.0% to UAH 2.8bn; and
- expenditures for social protection and social security decreased by 26.2% to UAH 9.2bn.

Expenditures for financing pensions, bonuses and extras to the pensions awarded under pension schemes, and for covering the deficit of the Pension Fund, amounted to UAH 8.6bn, which is 27.1% less year-on-year.

The state budget proceeds from repaid loans totaled UAH 59.0mil in July of this year.
 In July 2017, the state budget provided loans for a total of UAH 438.7mn.

The state budget deficit totaled UAH 2.0bn this month.

Repayment of the state budget debt principal totaled UAH 18.1bn in July 2017, including internal debt repayment of UAH 16.9bn and external debt repayment of UAH 1.2mn.

State borrowing totaled UAH 28.2bn, with UAH 27.9bn borrowed on the internal market. External sources **provided loans** for a total of UAH 241.5mil credited to a special fund for financing joint development projects with international financial institutions.

The state budget received UAH 80.80mn from the **privatization of state property** in July 2017.

• The total local budget revenues (without inter-budget transfers) amounted to nearly UAH 123.0bn in January-July 2017, which is 36.5% more year-on-year.

Those revenues totaled UAH 18.7bn in July 2017, which is 31.1% more year-on-year. As usual, personal income tax was the single largest source of local budget revenues. It generated UAH 9.4bn in July. Local taxes and fees provided UAH 5.1bn.

The highest growth of revenues by region was in Zakarpattya Oblast, where it rose to 63.9% year-on-year. Revenue decreased in Luhansk Oblast (-4.7%).

• The local budget expenditures (without inter-budget transfers) totaled UAH 245.8bn in January-July 2017, which is 45.7% more year-on-year.

Expenditures grew by 23.7% in July 2017 against July of last year and amounted to nearly UAH 31.2bn. The largest amounts of local budget expenditures were allocated for social protection and social security, healthcare, and education. They amounted to UAH 7.5bn (or 23.9% of all local budget expenditures), UAH 6.9bn (22.3%), and UAH 6.8bn (21.7%), respectively.

The highest growth rate by region was in Vinnytsia Oblast, where expenditures rose 50.9% year-on-year. The lowest growth of expenditures (4.7%) was in Ivano-Frankivsk Oblast.

in 2012–2017 (Less Intergovernmental Transfers)





Dynamics of the Share of Ukraine's State Budget Revenue in

Annual Amounts in 2012–2017





in July 2012–2017





in January-July 2012–2017






State Budget Value Added Tax Monthly Trends


Dynamics of Monthly State Budget Revenues from Excise Tax on

Local Budget Revenue Monthly Trends (Less Intergovernmental Transfers) in 2012–2017





Dynamics of the Share of Local Budget Revenue in Annual Amounts in 2012–2017

in January-July 2012–2017







Structure of Local Budget Revenues in July y 2017




Regional Distribution of Local Budget Revenue in July 2016–2017

Diagram 6 **Budget Deficit/Surplus, Monthly Trends in 2012**




Diagram 7 **Budget Deficit/Surplus, Monthly Trends in 2013**




Diagram 8 **Budget Deficit/Surplus, Monthly Trends in 2014**




Diagram 9 **Budget Deficit/Surplus, Monthly Trends in 2015**



Budget Deficit/Surplus, Monthly Trends in 2016






Diagram 11 **Budget Deficit/Surplus, Monthly Trends in 2017**



in 2012–2017





in 2012–2017



Structure of Actual Expenditures of Ukraine's State Budget by Functional Classification in 2012



by Functional Classification in 2013



by Functional Classification in 2014



by Functional Classification in 2015



by Functional Classification in 2016




Monthly Trends of State Budget Expenditures in 2012–2017




Dynamics of the Share of Ukraine's State Budget Total


Expenditures in Annual Amounts in 2012–2017



in July 2012–2017



in January-July 2012–2017






State Budget Expenditures for Public Debt Servicing


State Budget Expenditures for Defense, Monthly Trends in 2012–2017

State Budget Expenditures for Public Order, Security, and the


Judiciary, Monthly Trends in 2012–2017

State Budget Expenditures for Economic Activities,



State Budget Expenditures for Environmental Protection,



State Budget Expenditures for the Housing and Communal Sector,



State Budget Expenditures for Healthcare,



State Budget Expenditures for Spiritual and Physical Development,



State Budget Expenditures for Education,



Total Local Budget Expenditures (Less Intergovernmental Transfers), Monthly Trends in 2012-2017




in January-July 2012–2017



in July 2017




Structure of Local Budget Expenditures by Functional Classification in July 2017


