Monitoring of the Execution of the Consolidated, State and Local Budgets in Ukraine

- The actual intake of revenues of the consolidated budget of Ukraine totaled UAH 667.2bn in January-August 2017, which is UAH 201.9bn or 43.4% more year-on-year.
- The state budget received UAH 523.5bn in the same period, which is UAH 165.0bn or 46.0% more year-on-year. This amount equals 67.9% of the annual plan. Even with the increased annual target based on the results of state budget performance in the first six months of the year, this is significantly more than the period's share in the total annual revenues in the last ten years, which amounted to 62.6% on average. This continues to point to a high likelihood of the plan overachievement in annual terms.

All of the main items of both tax and non-tax revenues grew on a year-on-year basis both by month and for the period of January through August in general. Specific gains include: the personal income tax by UAH 10.2bn (or 27.5%); corporate profit tax by UAH 12.1bn (or 34.4%); VAT on goods made in Ukraine by UAH 27.4bn (or 31.0%); VAT on goods imported in Ukraine by UAH 43.6bn (or 38.9%); excise tax on goods made in Ukraine by UAH 7.2bn (or 20.7%); rent and fees for use of other natural resources by UAH 8.9bn (or 33.7%); and import duty by UAH 2.4bn (or 19.5%).

Non-tax revenues also increased (by UAH 49.4bn or nearly 2.3 times). This occurred mainly due to the transfer by the National Bank of Ukraine of UAH 30.0bn according to the Law of Ukraine "On the National Bank of Ukraine," and also due to an increase in revenues from dividends accrued on shares (stock, interest) of economic entities, which have state property in their statutory capital, by UAH 13.8bn or more than ten times.

• Expenditures of the consolidated budget totaled UAH 598.3bn, which is 25.8% or UAH 122.8bn more than the respective indicator of 2016. In August 2017, the expenditures totaled UAH 84.4bn, which is 30.1% or UAH 19.6bn more than in August 2016.

The amounts of consolidated budget expenditures increased for all items under functional classification of expenditures compared to respective 2016 indicators.

The highest growth (up 56.7% against August 2016) is noted in expenditures for healthcare, which reached UAH 8.8bn. Considerable increase is recorded in the expenditures for economic activity (51.1%), general government functions (50.0%), education (29.2%), social protection and social security (27.1%), public order, security, and the judiciary (23.3%), housing and communal services (21.1%), protection of natural environment (19.5%), spiritual and physical development (7.9%), and defense (7.9%).

• The actual expenditures of the state budget of Ukraine totaled UAH 489.1bn in January-August 2017, which is 21.3% or UAH 95.9bn more year-on-year. In August 2017, expenditures totaled UAH 68.6bn or 29.0% more than in August 2016.

The following changes were observed according to the **functional classification** compared to August 2016:

- expenditures for general government functions (without expenditures for state debt servicing) increased by 45.4% to UAH 2.5bn. The expenditures for state debt servicing totaled UAH 9.0bn, up 22.1% year-on-year;
- defense spending increased by 7.9% to UAH 5.6bn;
- expenditures for public order, security, and the judiciary increased by 22.9% to UAH 7.2bn;
- expenditures for economic activity increased by 29.5% to UAH 4.5bn;

- expenditures for environmental protection increased by 2.0% to UAH 214.6mn;
- expenditures for housing and communal services increased by 42.4% to UAH 1.1mn;
- expenditures for healthcare increased 3.5 times to UAH 2.1bn;
- expenditures for spiritual and physical development decreased by 14.2% to UAH 699.6mn;
- expenditures for education increased by 4.4% to UAH 2.2bn; and
- expenditures for social protection and social security decreased by 14.2% to UAH 11.3bn.

Expenditures for financing the disbursement of pensions, bonuses, and extras to the pensions awarded under pensions programs, and for covering the deficit of the Pension Fund totaled UAH 10.5bn, which is 15.5% less year-on-year.

The state budget receipts from repaid loans totaled UAH 703.0mn in August 2017.

The state budget **provided loans** for the total of UAH 521.2mn in August 2017.

The state budget surplus amounted to UAH 11.5bn this month.

Repayment of the state debt principal totaled UAH 11.3bn in August 2017, including internal debt repayment of UAH 4.5bn and external debt repayment of UAH 6.8bn.

State borrowing totaled UAH 11.5bn, with UAH 11.0bn mobilized on the internal market. External sources **provided loans** totaling UAH 417.1mn, which were remitted to a special fund for financing joint development projects with international finance institutions.

The state budget received UAH 1.3bn from **privatization of state property** in August 2017.

• The total local budget revenues (without inter-budget transfers) amounted to nearly UAH 143.7bn in January-August 2017, which is 34.6% more year-on-year.

In August 2017, these revenues totaled UAH 20.7bn, which is 24.2% more than the respective last year's indicator. As usual, the personal income tax was the single largest source of local budget revenues, which generated UAH 9.3bn in August. Local taxes and fees provided UAH 5.7bn.

The highest growth rate by region was in Volyn Oblast, where it amounted to 49.6% year-on-year. The lowest growth in revenues was in Luhansk Oblast (0.8%).

• The local budget expenditures (without inter-budget transfers) totaled over UAH 284.9bn in January-August 2017, which is 47.6% more year-on-year.

In August 2017, expenditures grew by 60.7% year-on-year and amounted to more than UAH 39.1bn. The largest proportions of local budgets were allocated for social protection and social security, education, and healthcare. They amounted to UAH 15.1bn (or 38.5% of all local budget expenditures), UAH 6.8bn (or 17.4%), and UAH 6.7bn (17.3%), respectively.

The highest growth rate by region was in Donetsk Oblast, where the expenditures more than doubled year-on-year. The lowest growth in expenditures (30.8%) was in Kherson Oblast.

in 2012–2017 (Less Intergovernmental Transfers)





Dynamics of the Share of Ukraine's State Budget Revenue in

Annual Amounts in 2012–2017





in August 2012–2017





in January-August 2012–2017






State Budget Value Added Tax Monthly Trends


Dynamics of Monthly State Budget Revenues from Excise Tax on

Local Budget Revenue Monthly Trends (Less Intergovernmental Transfers) in 2012–2017







Graph 10 **Growth Rates of Local Budget Revenue** in January-August 2012-2017








Structure of Local Budget Revenues in August y 2017

Diagram 6 **Budget Deficit/Surplus, Monthly Trends in 2012**




Diagram 7 **Budget Deficit/Surplus, Monthly Trends in 2013**




Diagram 8 **Budget Deficit/Surplus, Monthly Trends in 2014**




Diagram 9 **Budget Deficit/Surplus, Monthly Trends in 2015**



Budget Deficit/Surplus, Monthly Trends in 2016






Diagram 11 **Budget Deficit/Surplus, Monthly Trends in 2017**



in 2012–2017





in 2012–2017



Structure of Actual Expenditures of Ukraine's State Budget by Functional Classification in 2012



Structure of Actual Expenditures of Ukraine's State Budget



by Functional Classification in 2014



by Functional Classification in 2015



by Functional Classification in 2016




Monthly Trends of State Budget Expenditures in 2012–2017




Expenditures in Annual Amounts in 2012–2017





in August 2012–2017



in January-August 2012–2017






State Budget Expenditures for Public Debt Servicing


State Budget Expenditures for Defense, Monthly Trends in 2012–2017

State Budget Expenditures for Public Order, Security, and the


Judiciary, Monthly Trends in 2012–2017

State Budget Expenditures for Economic Activities,





Monthly Trends in 2012–2017





State Budget Expenditures for Healthcare,




State Budget Expenditures for Spiritual and Physical Development,

Monthly Trends in 2012–2017



Total Local Budget Expenditures (Less Intergovernmental Transfers), Monthly Trends in 2012–2017





Dynamics of the Share of Local Budget Expenditures in Annual Amounts in 2012–2017

Growth Rates of Local Budget Expenditures in January-August 2012–2017



in August 2017






Diagram 21
